Fizzy Sherbet

	<p>Per Joey</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">1/2 tsp Citric Acid1/4 tsp Bi-carb of Soda3 Tbsp Icing Sugar1/2 tsp Jelly Crystals if desired <p>Add the ingredients to a zip loc bag, mix and eat with a lollypop.</p>
<p>Did You Know?</p> <p>The acid makes the icing sugar taste tangy. When bicarbonate soda is added, it reacts with the acid to make bubbles of carbon dioxide gas, which makes the sherbet fizzy on your tongue. Be careful - if you eat too much, you will burp a lot from all that gas!</p>	

What Is It?

	<p>A blindfold per Joey</p> <p>A black bag</p> <p>A collection of different objects (spoons, keys, wooden objects, papers, fabrics etc.)</p> <p>Place the items in the bag. Pass around to the blindfolded Joeys and they have to identify which items are in the bag.</p>
<p>Did You Know?</p> <p>We often use our senses to work out what is in the world around us. For some people, who are blind or deaf, this process becomes much more difficult. In this activity, the sense of touch was probably the most useful.</p>
