

Bike Safety/Road Rules Scavenger Hunt

Equipment:

Bike Safety/Road Rules sheet, pencils, laminated card answers, Duct tape, string, premade bike licences, permanent pens

Discuss buddies - and complete with a buddy.

Each buddy team is given a Bike Safety/Road Safety sheet to work on together. Prior to the activity the answer cards have been placed around the area. Each buddy team on handing in their sheet receives a "bike licence". These are laminated and Joeys can add their name with permanent marker.



When riding a bicycle you are required by law to wear an approved bicycle helmet securely fitted and fastened on your head.



Wear bright clothes during the day and a reflective vest at night.



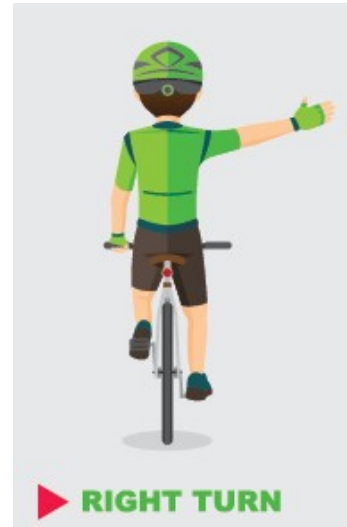
Under NSW Road Rules, your bicycle must be fitted with at least one working bell or horn, or similar warning device.



By law you must have your lights on between sunset and sunrise and in bad weather.



This is a shared path for pedestrians and bicycle riders.



You are required by law to give a hand signal when turning right or merging to the right lane.



When riding a shared path keep to the left at all times and give way to pedestrians.



You are not allowed to ride your bike on the pedestrian crossing.



This is a roundabout sign. You must travel in a clockwise direction and give way to traffic already on the roundabout.



Since July 2018 children under 16 years of age are allowed to ride on the footpath.
